Course overview

Our multidisciplinary course will focus on giving you a firm academic base in the core disciplines of aviation management, with a particular focus on the international business setting. It will help you develop an understanding of the global business environment in which airlines and airports operate through the study of economics, human resources, marketing and finance.

Integral to this course is the development of essential skills and knowledge necessary to become a high-ranking aviation professional in a number of possible career routes, including airline operations management, engineering management and airline strategy. Our lecturers have excellent links with members of the aviation community and they're perfectly placed to offer you career advice specific to the sector.

We place emphasis on advancing your decision-making skills on an operational, international and strategic level. Although you'll specialise in airline, airport and aviation management, the course will also equip you with transferable skills that are necessary for a career in international business management. These skills are developed through engagement with real-life and virtual business challenges, providing you with the opportunity to study core aspects of management and

leadership that are relevant in business.

You'll have the opportunity to visit major international airlines, airports and commercial aircraft manufacturers. Our location places us close to UK headquarters of a number of leading aviation companies, such as Boeing and Bombardier, and a short distance from all major London airports such as Gatwick, Heathrow, London City, Luton and Stansted. Owing to our location and links with the industry, we often welcome visiting lecturers from airlines, airports, maintenance organisations, consultancy organisations and aircraft manufacturers.

Our dynamic Aviation Society will introduce you to university life, organise regular trips and invite guest speakers to the University. Our top priorities are educational resources and the quality of teaching. In addition to the University's extensive facilities and resources, you'll have access to database services, aviation journals and magazines appropriate to aviation management studies.

Graduating with work experience will make you more likely to get into your desired career. Therefore we'll provide you with the opportunity to undertake practical and career-enhancing modules as part of your studies. In Year 2 or 3 you can study our work-related learning module and the University will advertise suitable opportunities and provide guidance. However, please note that we can't guarantee you work experience.

Why study this course?

Designed in conjunction with senior aviation managers, our Airline, Airport and Aviation Management BSc degree course recognises the demand in today's international aviation community for graduates with sound business skills and a good understanding of the entire aviation system. Aviation is an exciting industrial sector that ranges from the technological excellence of aviation engineering to the management of global airlines and airports.

Our airport, airline and aviation management courses ranked highly in the latest National Student Survey (NSS), scoring 97% for overall student satisfaction. Our management studies courses are first in London for overall student satisfaction according to the National Student Survey 2022.

Entry requirements

In addition to the University's standard entry requirements, you should have:

- a minimum of grades CCC in three A levels (or a minimum of 96 UCAS points from an equivalent Level 3 qualification, eg BTEC National, OCR Diploma or Advanced Diploma)
- English Language and Mathematics GCSE at grade C/grade 4 or above (or equivalent)

If you don't have traditional qualifications or can't meet the entry requirements for this

undergraduate degree, you may still be able to gain entry by completing our Airline, Airport and Aviation Management (including foundation year) BSc (Hons) degree.

Accelerated study

If you have relevant qualifications or credit from a similar course it may be possible to enter this course at an advanced stage rather than beginning in the first year. Please note, advanced entry is only available for September start. See our information for students applying for advanced entry.

Assessment

You'll be assessed through written coursework, oral presentations, individual and group research projects, portfolio work, problem-solving case studies and a final research project of 8,000 words.



Libraries and study areas

Our libraries provide a wide range of information and resources, as well as silent learning zones, bookable group study rooms and comfy informal spaces where you can meet and study collaboratively. There are PCs as well as printing and copying facilities.

To save you time, there are self-service facilities to borrow, return, renew or reserve an item. Our print and digital resources include books, journals, and databases, some of which are available online 24 hours a day via our web-based catalogue. We also have self-service laptop loan lockers that allow you to borrow one to take to lectures, a nearby café or your favourite study spot.

Our academic liaison librarians also provide learning support and help with finding and using library resources for your studies. You can make an appointment to see your librarian for advice.

Our library service is a member of the Society of College, National and University Libraries (SCONUL Access). This gives you the opportunity to access the many other university libraries that also belong to the scheme.

School offices

Studying a degree at London Met is an investment in your future. According to the Office for National Statistics, graduates earn significantly more than non-graduates, so investing in a degree now can pay off later.





How much will my course cost if I start in September 2022 or January 2023?

Tuition fees for Home students are regulated by the UK government. For 2022-23 these will be £9,250. Fees for international students (including students from the EU) are published on our online course pages when they're available. Fees are reviewed annually and are likely to change to take into account inflationary increases.

What funding is available?

If you're a UK student, you may be able to borrow money to help cover your fees and get help with living costs. If you're eligible for a tuition fee loan, you usually don't need to pay back your loan until you have completed your course and are earning £27,295 or more per year. There are also other sources of funding to help you pay your living costs (these are usually means-tested). Registration at the University and enrolment on a course will be subject to you complying with the University's registration procedure and your acceptance of the conditions of enrolment and the University's regulations (copies of which can be found at Indonmet.ac.uk/regulations).

When you enrol you are personally liable to pay your tuition and other fees in line with the University's Fees Regulations (visit londonmet.ac.uk/regulations). If you have outstanding University debts, you will not be permitted to re-enrol at the University in future years and if you are in your final year of study and any part of your tuition fees is outstanding your award may be withheld and you will not be permitted to attend a graduation ceremony.

Tuition fees for Home students are regulated by the UK government. For 2022–23 these will be $\mathfrak{L}9,250$. Fees for international students (including students from the EU) are published on our online course pages when they're available. Fees are reviewed annually and are likely to change to take into account inflationary increases.
